Centuries of chattel slavery, followed by a legal system that denied black Americans access to capital, housing, and employment, has had lasting detrimental effects on this community. We recognize that black and brown communities have been historically underfunded and over-policed. Moreover, black and brown communities rarely find parity of representation in our institutions and government which means they have less access to the power to make changes. As a society, we must take more action to address these issues. Until we undertake significant efforts to dismantle racism through anti-racist teaching and practices, including challenging and acknowledging our privilege, we will not achieve the structural change, and healing that we need.
